Cycle's of Faith

3rd Sunday of Easter

The Book of Revelation uses highly symbolic language to communicate its message to the church in the first century as Christians were being persecuted. The author, who calls himself John (not the Gospel writer), wants to assure the community that Jesus lives, hope endures, and the final victory is theirs, if they are faithful to Christ. Turning away from him as a short-term expediency is not the solution, even though the allure of avoiding persecution may seem stronger than being true to Christ.

Some of the visions that John writes about, like the one we hear in today's second reading, are meant to reveal what is the final end for those who remain faithful and endure the trial. They surround the throne and cry out in praise of God. They live in blessedness. One of the great comforts of this vision is the way in which John describes the throng gathered around the throne of God: "They were countless in number" (Rev 5:11).

In the Gospel today, we hear of the miraculous catch of fish made by the disciples after Jesus' resurrection. Standing on the shore, he directs them to lower their nets one more time, even though they had been hard at it all night. The result is that they haul in an incredible catch. The underlying theme of this miracle, as well as the message revealed in the Book of Revelation, is that God's mercy is without end. Through the resurrection of Christ, God wills that all people be saved. While the visions of the second reading from Revelation reveal the final outcome, the story of the Gospel today reminds us that we disciples have to keep cooperating with God's grace to help bring others into the fold. Seven Dolors' Endowment Update

Seven Dolors Parish has three Endowment Funds which support the Parish, the Cemetery and Holy Family School. In our Endowment Fund Bylaws #4 states: "Only the income (interest or dividends) from the endowment fund shall be used", the principle may not be used. Therefore, any contribution to the fund continues giving since it is a perpetual gift and only the investment income can be spent.

Since being established in 1993 the Endowment has generated over \$270,000 in interest investments for the school & parish. The Endowment Committee and our investment company-RBC Wealth Management, have been keeping a close watch on our investments during the recent changes in the stock market. After incurring about a 21% loss, we are pleased to inform you that since March 2009 the total of our Endowment Fund has increased in value by over \$167,000 to a total of \$773,460 (our March 2010 report) which is about 1% above the value prior to the declining market. Thank you for your questions and concerns on how our/your investments are performing in today's market.

Gifts to the Parish, Cemetery and Holy Family School Endowment Funds are always appreciated and are in most cases tax deductible; please consult your tax professional or financial planner. You may also want to consider gifting appreciated stock, mutual funds, real estate or other items of value.
