Cycle's of Faith

31st Sunday in Ordinary Time

The King James Bible is four hundred years old this year. While it is not an authorized translation for Catholics, it has had a profound impact on the English language. Phrases such as, "A house divided against itself cannot stand" (Mt 12:25); "An eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth" (Mt 5:38); and "Pearls before swine" (Mt 7:6), all entered common parlance in English after the King James translation was made available. While many of the phrases were used in earlier English translations, it was the King James Version that actually popularized many of these sayings. As people became more familiar with the text, words employed in the translation began to appear more frequently as well.

Today's Gospel passage is the one that gives rise to the word "pharisaical." Matthew, who portrays Jesus in the Sermon on the Mount as the new lawgiver who enlarges the law of Moses given at Sinai, takes on the scribes and the Pharisees. As Jesus indicates, they sit in the seat of Moses, but their example is hardly in line with him. They tie up heavy burdens for people. They are self-righteous. They make their importance felt. They practice strict observance in externals without concern for the inner spirit of the law. They are, in the words of the English translation, "pharisaical."

Jesus expects his followers to act in a different way. As we learned last week, the law demands love of God and love of neighbor. And while external religious acts can indicate an enduring love of God, no one can judge the hearts of others in reference to their prayers. Only God knows an individual's love of him. But the ways that one loves a neighbor can be clearly seen, by one's actions of charity in caring for the poor, aiding the sick, and helping the oppressed. It is clear from the Gospel today that Jesus expects his followers to be servants of all. ©2011 Liturgical Publications Inc

New Translation of the Roman Missal Nov. 26-27

3. What's new or different about the revised translation?

The style of the translation of the third edition is different. In accord with the rules for translation established by the Holy See, the revised translation follows the style of the original Latin texts more closely, including concrete images, repetition, parallelisms, and rhythm. The English used in the Mass texts is more formal and dignified in style. Where possible, the texts follow the language of Scripture and include many poetic images. In addition, the third edition contains prayers for the celebration of recently canonized saints, additional prefaces for the Eucharistic Prayers, additional Masses and prayers for various needs and intentions, and some updated and revised rubrics (or instructions) for the celebration of the Mass.

4. What is the timeline for the approval and implementation of the Missal?

After the Latin Missale Romanum was published in 2002, The International Commission on English in the Liturgy (ICEL) began its work of preparing a draft English translation of the text. ICEL presented the first section—the Order of Mass, which contains the fixed prayers of the Mass, including the people's parts—to the English speaking conferences of bishops in 2004. The USCCB approved the final version in 2006, and the Holy See confirmed this section in June 2008. The remaining sections were approved between 2007 and 2009. The USCCB completed its approval of the Missal in November 2009. The Holy See granted the final approval of the text in the spring of 2010. Cardinal Francis George, OMI, president of the USCCB, announced that parishes may begin using the revised translation on Nov. 27, 2011.
